The Year will:

- launch a major debate on the benefits of diversity for European societies;
- make people more aware of their rights to enjoy or belief, disability, age and sexual orientation; irrespective of sex, racial or ethnic origin, religion equal treatment and a life free of discrimination -
- promote equal opportunities for all.



Did you know?

- Most Europeans believe that a person's ethnic origin, religion, disability or age can be an obstacle in finding a job, even when qualifications
- Women in Europe are still paid on average 15% occupy less than a quarter of parliamentary seats in the EU. less than men to do the same job. They still only
- Older workers have an employment rate of 40% than double the overall rate in Europe. compared to the EU average of 62%. Unemployment among young people is more

Hundreds of activities are being planned across Europe in all 25 EU countries as well as Bulgaria, Romania, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein as part of the 2007 European Year of Equal Opportunities for All.

European events will kick off with:

- the first ever "Equality summit" in Berlin on 30–31 January 2007, where EU ministers, trade unions, employers' organisations and non-governmental organisations will officially launch the 2007 European Year;
- a new survey on what Europeans think about discrimination; and
- a pan-European information campaign to promote the benefits of equality and diversity for Europe.

In addition, many activities, conferences and projects will be held in your country, region or city: the Year is not run only from Brussels! On the contrary, each country must select priority areas and national activities to be funded, which could, for example, include awards for companies with strong diversity policies or competitions for schools on the theme of respect and tolerance.

What can I do?

Everyone can play their part in the 2007 European Year. All of us can start by looking at our own behaviour and attitudes. You can also take part in the Year by organising or joining in an event that is taking place near you. Whether it's small businesses, youth groups, NGOs, trade unions or schools, the Year can only be a success when everyone gets on board.
